

2025 Early Acceptance Scholarship

Terms and Conditions

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The 2025 Early Acceptance Scholarship may be offered to international students who meet the below eligibility criteria and are commencing their studies in an eligible course in any study period in 2025.
 - 1.1. This scholarship provides a 15% reduction on registered tuition fees for the full duration of eligible courses for a maximum of 4 years.
 - 1.2. The scholarship will be given in the form of a 15% annual tuition fee scholarship applied to tuition fees at the start of each study period provided the recipient is enrolled post census date in an eligible course and is studying onshore in Australia.
 - 1.3. Recipients of the Tasmanian International Scholarship (25%) are also eligible for the Early Acceptance Scholarship but at a reduced rate of 10%. This means that the maximum scholarship package that can be awarded is a total of a 35% reduction on registered tuition fees for the full duration of the course.

ELIGIBILITY OF APPLICANTS

2. To be eligible, applicants must meet all the following criteria:
 - 2.1. be classified as an International Student as defined under the application rules of the University of Tasmania;
 - 2.2. commencing at the University of Tasmania for the first time in any study period in 2025;
 - 2.3. meet one of the following criteria:
 - 2.3.1. be a citizen of Bahrain, China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, South Korea, Kuwait, Malaysia, Oman, Qatar, United Arab Emirates, Japan, Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, or Vietnam, OR
 - 2.3.2. be residing onshore in Australia at the time of applying for their student visa,
 - 2.4. be enrolled in one of the following eligible courses:
 - 2.4.1. All undergraduate Bachelor and Honours coursework programs (excluding Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine, Bachelor of Nursing in Hobart and Sydney, Bachelor of Applied Science (Nautical Science), Bachelor of Applied Science (Marine Engineering); and fully on-line only programs); and
 - 2.4.2. All postgraduate coursework programs (excluding Master of Psychology (Clinical), Master of Physiotherapy, Master of Speech Pathology, Master of Occupational Therapy, and fully on-line programs).
 - 2.5. accept their offer on or after 14th October 2024 and before the scholarship deadline specified on their offer letter.
 - 2.6. be enrolled fulltime, (a minimum 37.5 credit points for each study period is considered full time);
 - 2.7. not be a student enrolling in a course at the University's International Pathway College;
 - 2.8. not be a student from a Transnational Education (**TNE**) partner affiliated with the University of Tasmania;
 - 2.9. not commencing at the University of Tasmania through an articulation agreement with

- a partner institution (e.g. 2 + 2 degree programs); and
- 2.10.** not have received academic credit or advanced standing for their eligible course.
- 2.11.** The scholarship recipient may not defer the commencement of their Eligible Course beyond 2025;
- 2.12.** Scholarship recipients who have an approved Leave of Absence during their study will have their scholarships suspended until they return at the end of their approved break (up to a maximum of 12 months); and
- 2.13.** The scholarship recipient must not be in receipt of any other University of Tasmania scholarship or any external sponsorship with the exception of:
 - 2.13.1.** the English Language Package scholarship AND/OR
 - 2.13.2.** Tasmanian International Scholarship (25%) whereby the Early Acceptance Scholarship will be offered at the reduced rate of 10% instead of 15%.

ALLOCATION OF SCHOLARSHIP

- 3.** Applicants will be notified whether they have been awarded the scholarship in their Letter of Offer.

USE OF IMAGE

- 4.** Any photographs and/or videos, taken by the University, of 2025 Early Acceptance Scholarship recipients may be used in publicity material to promote the University and its scholarship program. By agreeing to these terms and conditions, the scholarship recipient agrees to the use of photos and videos, and agrees that the University may reproduce, and/or publish their image, their name and story in relation to the scholarship without compensation.

ACTIONS RENDERING THE SCHOLARSHIP VOID

- 5.** This scholarship cannot be combined with another University of Tasmania scholarship or bursary (excluding a support package) and this scholarship is non-transferable and cannot be redeemed for cash.
 - 5.1.** This scholarship will be discontinued if the recipient:
 - 5.1.1.** defers their start date beyond 2025;
 - 5.1.2.** completes their course early;
 - 5.1.3.** is unable to pay their fees by the due date each semester;
 - 5.1.4.** withdraws from their course/s;
 - 5.1.5.** is excluded from the University for any reason;
 - 5.1.6.** does not enrol in any units within a half year period without an approved Leave of Absence
 - 5.1.7.** is absent from study for more than 12 months; and
 - 5.1.8.** breaches of any of the University's ordinances, rules of conduct, policies and procedures.
 - 5.2.** If at any stage during or following the process of assessing and awarding a scholarship, any documents provided as part of the recipient's international student application is found not to be genuine; the scholarship will be immediately withdrawn.
 - 5.3.** International students on a Student Visa (subclass 500) must continue to satisfy the

criteria for the grant of a visa and must maintain satisfactory attendance in their course and course progress for each study period as required by the University of Tasmania.

GOVERNANCE

6. All scholarships are awarded at the University's discretion.
 - 6.1. The University of Tasmania reserves the right to revoke any scholarship at any time if a student is found to have provided information that is false or misleading, does not meet the scholarship eligibility criteria (including admission requirements), or does not comply with the ongoing scholarship conditions.
 - 6.2. The University excludes all liability to the maximum extent permitted by law.
 - 6.3. These terms and conditions are governed by the laws of Tasmania.

COMMUNICATION

7. Any communication relating to the Early Acceptance Scholarship will be sent to the email address provided in the application to study.

VARIATION OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS

8. The University reserves the right to update or amend these terms and conditions at any time without prior notice. The University will provide notice of any changes to these terms and conditions in writing if it deems it necessary and practical.

REVIEW REQUIREMENTS

9. All decisions made by the University of Tasmania in respect to the scholarship are final and not subject to review.
