For the Christmas holiday Queens run their 'Lo Lo Lo' competition where staff are encouraged to turn off appliances. The two departments who save the most energy receive £250



University of Leicester Students' Union – Snap It Off!


Students used union branded signs to show their university who was behind the campaign – 50 photos were uploaded on one day of action!




Water

Rabbits and waste paper at Ulster


A team member at the University of Ulster has been taking their shredded waste paper home to line her rabbits hutch!







The Finance team had a shared interest in gardening and started up their own community garden!










UCLAN – Growing vegetables


Health and Wellbeing
