



Schools Recommendation Program

No matter what happens, we have a place for you. Together with schools, we've introduced a program to help year 12 students get ahead.

Our 2024 program lets you apply early for our range of exciting, diverse courses.

What is the Schools Recommendation Program?

This program allows you to apply for our undergraduate courses and receive your offers much earlier in the year.

How does the program work?

Australian year 12 students can apply for up to five courses at the end of June. Rather than an ATAR, your application is based on your school's recommendation. This recommendation can factor in your year 11 results, as well as other considerations.

If you don't receive an offer for your dream course through the Schools Recommendation Program, you will be re-assessed for a higher preference offer once your ATAR is released.

We will release offers from August through to early November, which will take the pressure off you during year 12.


What courses will I be able to apply for?

The program will be open to nearly all of our courses, including our new flexible double degrees, undergraduate degrees, associate degrees and pathway programs.

Courses in Paramedicine and Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine work differently. Entry to these courses is very competitive, so an early offer is not available. However we still encourage you to apply as part of your Schools Recommendation Program application.

You will be assessed for these preferences once your ATAR is released, and will not be assessed through the Schools Recommendation Program. You may still receive early offers to other preferences you have included.

How to order your preferences

In your application, you'll be asked to add up to 5 courses. Here's how to choose their order.

1st preference	Desired course	This is your dream course.
2nd preference 3rd preference 4th preference	Courses of interests*	These are other courses you're interested in studying. These are particularly important if your course isn't included in the program or if your first preference has high entry requirements.
5th preference	Pathway course	A course that will support your personal learning journey and help you upgrade into a preferred course on completion.

^{*}If you don't meet the entry requirements, you will be offered a pathway option to your course offer.
